The company provides an extensive and wide range of products: protection mattress, beaconing & protecting nets, panels & signage, anchorage for winch snow compactors, personal protective equipment, inflatable structures, products for special adventure walks in the forest...

With a team of 15 persons the company remains on a human scale and offers an environment where its employees can easily express their skills, only a few minutes away from the ski slopes...

Highlights have influenced the growth of the company like the Winter Olympics in Albertville which have played a major part in the reputation and the increase of the turnover.

ISO 9001 certification was obtained in May 2000 and shows the constant concern of the company to develop the quality of its products and services.

From the beginning, the turnover has been in constant evolution and export has become one of its main line of development. SECOMATE already exports on a regular and organized basis to Spain, Switzerland, Andorra and Italy. We also have customers in the U.S.A., South America, Norway, Lebanon ...

An important turning point for the company was the construction of a new building of 1.500m² where we are now since May 2007. Located in Tours en Savoie near Albertville, it is at the crossing of various valleys internationally famous for their ski industry: the Tarentaise Valley, the Val d'Arly and the Maurienne Valley.
